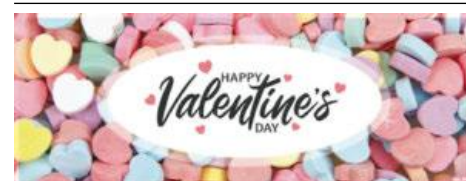
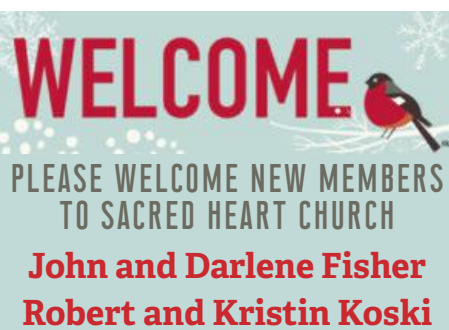

WALK WITH ONE

**It only takes one contact.
Go Listen.**



SomeONE in your life is longing for a relationship with Jesus—even if they don't know it yet. And Jesus is calling YOU to reach out to them. Whether they're questioning, hurting, or simply in need of a listening ear, Christ wants to work through YOU to bring them to an encounter that will transform their life. Listen to their story, and share your own. One conversation could be the beginning of their journey home.

STEP 1: Identify someone in a spirit of humility

STEP 2: Intercede for that person in communion with the Holy Spirit

STEP 3: Connect in Eucharistic friendship

STEP 4: Invite that ONE on a path most suitable for him or her

Throughout each stage of your "Walk with One" journey, we encourage you to pray the Eucharistic Examen to help you discern the path the Lord is calling you to follow.

During this National Eucharistic Revival, we pray with Pope Benedict XVI in his Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Eucharist and the indissolubility of marriage: When legitimate doubts exist about the validity of the prior sacramental marriage [before the subsequent divorce and remarriage], the necessary investigation must be carried out to establish [by an ecclesiastical tribunal] if these are well-founded. . . It is a grave obligation to bring the Church's institutional activity in her tribunals ever closer to the faithful. . . Pastoral care . . . begins by assuming that the fundamental point of encounter is love for the truth: truth is never something purely abstract, but "a real part of the human and Christian journey of every member of the faithful."

Sacramentum Caritatis 29

PRAY: Throughout the week... LORD, lead the Church in establishing tribunals whose members come "close to the faithful" with love and mercy, basing their pastoral care on the "love of truth." Guide them as they lead the faithful to a closer relationship with You that helps them walk in Your way through this situation. May they all keep You at the center and Your love in their hearts, enabling the faithful to live as You call them to live on their "Christian journey." Jesus we surrender this to You. Take care of everything. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to me? If I acknowledge marriage as the beautiful sign of "God's irrevocable love in Christ for his Church", I must recognize how this would make marriage also "irrevocable". I will pray for tribunal members to bear Christ's love and mercy to the faithful as they seek the truth in their investigation. And I myself will seek to be a witness of God's love to them, so they will desire and continue to make their "Christian journey as a member of the faithful".

Fraternal Correction

There is a huge contradiction between acceptable and unacceptable discourse among people. On one hand, we see vicious, public criticism of what people do, say and think, exacerbated by social media. On the other hand, any criticism of what people may do, say or think is also labeled judgmental, intolerant or hateful. Advocates of immoral behavior as "lifestyle choices" often cite Matthew 7:1: "Judge not lest you be judged." Yet we have an obligation for "fraternal correction," within certain limits, to approach people we know (our "brothers") who we see acting sinfully.

To "**Admonish the Sinner**," a *Spiritual Act of Mercy*, has a solid Biblical foundation. Just before the Commandment "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," Leviticus teaches "reprove your neighbor" (19:17-18). Any admonition must be for the person's good, made with generous love. Jesus said, "If your brother sins, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him" (Luke 17:3). When Jesus told the parable of a shepherd who left ninety-nine sheep to search for one stray, he revealed the Father's will that "not one be lost" (Matt 18:12-14). Jesus then instructed us how to approach a brother who has strayed: "Go tell him his fault **between you and him alone**. If he listens, you have won over your brother" (18:15). The one-on-one is important and contrasts with the indiscriminate public shaming of strangers seen today.

To foster good order in the early Church, St. Paul encouraged Christians to admonish one another: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you as in wisdom you teach and admonish one another" (Col 3:16); to "encourage one another, ... admonish the unruly, cheer the fainthearted, support the weak, be patient with all" (1Thes 5:11;14). See also Rom 15:14 and 2Tim 3:16.

It goes both ways. How prepared are we to accept and even seek out being admonished by a friend? We should: "Let the righteous smite me, it is mercy if he reproves me" (Psalm 141:5). And St. Paul wrote: "Respect those ... who admonish you and show esteem for them with love" (1Thes 5:12-13).

So what do we do with "judge not lest you be judged"? First, we don't admonish strangers. Second, we must remember we can't fully know the heart of even someone close to us, or all their circumstances. Only with great care and loving discernment ought we approach one we love, that they not be lost.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

What is the secret to sharing in God's power to overcome our difficulties? Mary teaches us this in the prophecy of her pierced heart. This Sunday, the old man Simeon prophesies that when her son faces opposition, Mary's soul will be pierced by a sword. The seemingly pointless agony of a mother helplessly watching her son be mocked, tortured, killed and then cruelly desecrated in death by a spear — somehow this piercing of her heart releases a power by which **"the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed"** (Luke 2:35). What to make of this?

Whatever problems we currently face, the deepest threat is finally that evil thoughts are hidden in the human heart: hatred, envy, pride, lust, greed and so on. Behind every tyrant's injustice, for example, is a heart unpierced by love. Evil hides in our hearts. Mary's pierced heart, and its suffering love for her son, reveals and scatters these evil thoughts, and replaces them with love, forgiveness, generosity and peace.

This week, I invite us to ponder Mary's pierced heart. Her heart is quietly at work for us in the Church and world, exposing our evil thoughts and making a path for her son's divine love. This is how she gently cooperates in our salvation. Closed hearts are our biggest problem; love-pierced hearts are the ultimate power to overcome every difficulty.

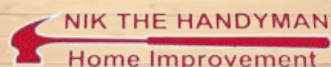
