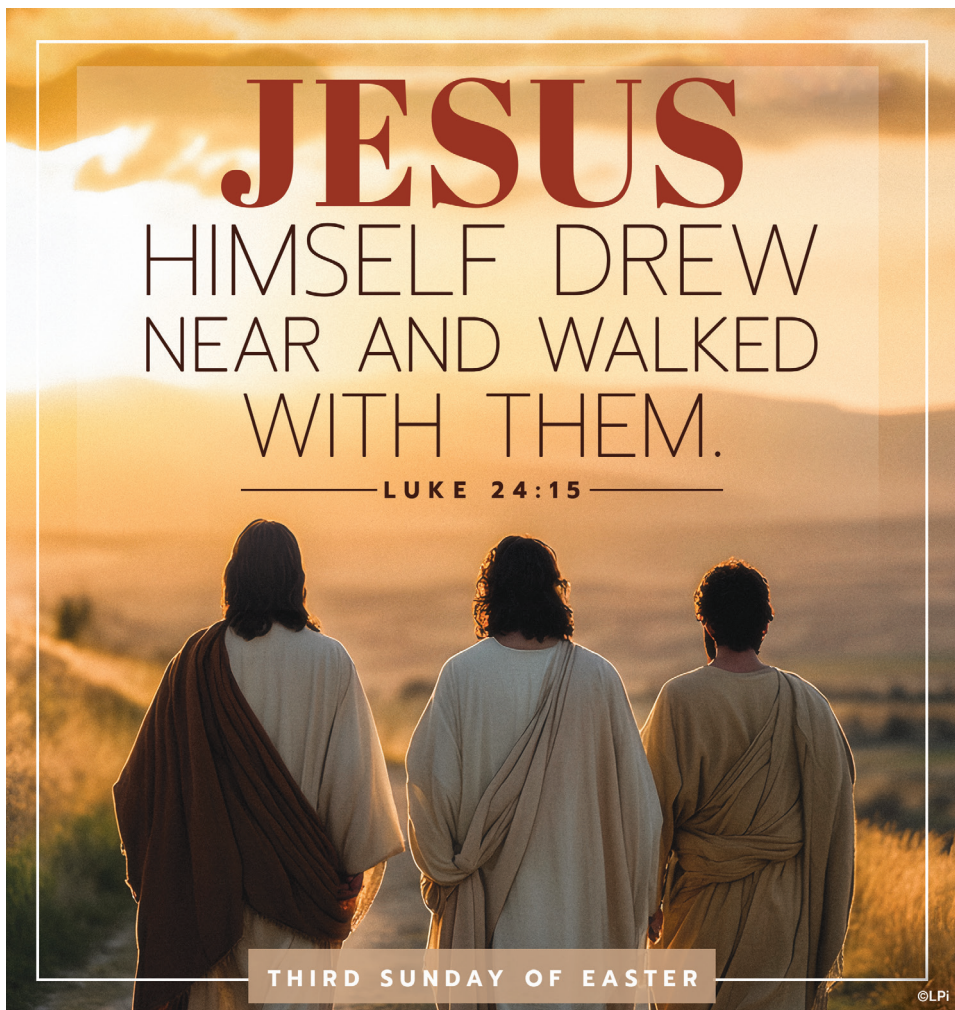

JOIN US FOR EVENING PRAYER (VESPERS) AT SACRED HEART

Come, join "... **the prayer of the Church with Christ and to Christ**" (*General Instruction of the Liturgy of the Hours*, 2). Vatican II urged the faithful to reclaim this ancient rhythm of sanctifying the day, reminding us that the Divine Office is meant not only for clergy and religious but for **all the People of God**.

With that spirit, we are delighted to begin **Evening Prayer (Vespers) in our parish in the church every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday at 6:00 PM starting Monday, April 20**

What to Expect

The prayer lasts **about 15 minutes** (initial few times likely to be longer due to explanations and training)

All materials are provided — no books or apps needed

Simple guidance will be offered each day for anyone new to the Liturgy of the Hours

All are welcome: individuals, families, and anyone seeking a gentle way to further sanctify the day.

Come and help us sanctify the evening hours with praise (GILH 39) as we join the universal Church in lifting our hearts to God.

Manna, Distraction, and the Daily Bread We Need: So what's the remedy for distraction? Just as God gave manna to Israel in the desert, he gives us His Son in the Eucharist as our "daily bread." Jesus makes the connection explicit: "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never hunger" (Jn 6:35). Unlike the Israelites, we can visit the "bread of heaven" every Sunday or even every day. Each Mass, each visit to the tabernacle, each hour before the Blessed Sacrament resets our compass.

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Easter (It is STILL Easter!) is an opportune time to walk with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. Which STEP are you on with that ONE? Time to TAKE another STEP?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

STEP 2 Seek God's BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, to shower BLESSings on your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE.

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Distribution & Reception of the Eucharist:

Another moment of the celebration needing to be mentioned is the distribution and reception of Holy Communion. I ask everyone, especially ordained ministers and those who, after adequate preparation and in cases of genuine need, are authorized to exercise the ministry of distributing the Eucharist, to make every effort to ensure that this simple act preserves its importance as a personal encounter with the Lord Jesus in the sacrament.

PRAY: Throughout the week... Lord Jesus, come! Come to us in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Pour out Your grace on those ministers of the Eucharist, that they would perform this "simple act" preserving its importance "as a personal encounter" with You in the sacrament. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to ME? If I am an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, do I "make every effort to ensure" that I act to "preserve its importance as a personal encounter with the Lord Jesus in the sacrament?" Do I appreciate the privilege and honor of being asked to perform such an act? If I am receiving the Eucharist, am I aware and appreciative of that act as a "personal encounter with the Lord Jesus in the sacrament?" Lord Jesus, as I serve as an EMHC at Mass, or as I receive You at Mass, give me the grace to truly know that it is You there in the Eucharist, and give You thanks for the blessing.

History of the Archdiocese Restructuring

Remember: The crucial parish **Listening Sessions** are coming up on **May 19th and 21st**. If you're not registered, **please do so today at restructuring.aod.org/**. This website also has lots of information about why the restructuring is necessary and information about every parish in the Archdiocese of Detroit (AOD), including history, characteristics, finances, and sacramental trends over recent years. Exploring the restructuring.aod.org/ website before the Listening Sessions will help you contribute well to the process.

It is worthwhile to recall the history of the current restructuring. This is the latest in an initiative that began in 2014 when Archbishop Vigneron called for a year of prayer for a new Pentecost. We were asked "to obey the Holy Spirit and be made by him a band of joyful missionary disciples," to live our Christ-given mandate to share the Gospel. Evangelization is why the Church and her parishes exist: to form witnesses strengthened through reception of the Sacraments. That year of prayer led to intercessory prayer groups, dialogue sessions, and Synod16, whose goal was to form "amazing," mission-focused parishes in Detroit. Absp. Vigneron's 2017 letter **Unleash the Gospel** aimed to support priests and build parishes where life-changing encounters with Jesus occur and where individuals and families are supported in their mission. Those goals remain today.

As *Unleash the Gospel* unfolded, COVID-19 brought a crushing halt that exacerbated the impact of declining Mass attendance, too few priests, and unsustainable buildings. The AOD pivoted to "Families of Parishes," seeking to support available priests serving parishes with fewer active members. Last year Vigneron released a pastoral note, "No Second Tunic," recognizing that renewal amid declining resources demanded more. That led Archbishop Weisenburger to initiate this AOD Restructuring.

It is a transparent process, seeking input from everyone. **YOUR OPINION MATTERS** in Listening Sessions. Multiple proposed "models" will show how parishes might form "pastorates" with one pastor. The archbishop wants to know what model YOU think would work best, or not at all, and why. He invites YOU to propose better models. In other dioceses, ~30% of models change based on parishioner input. More information will follow, but now it is critical that YOU register for and attend a Listening Session.

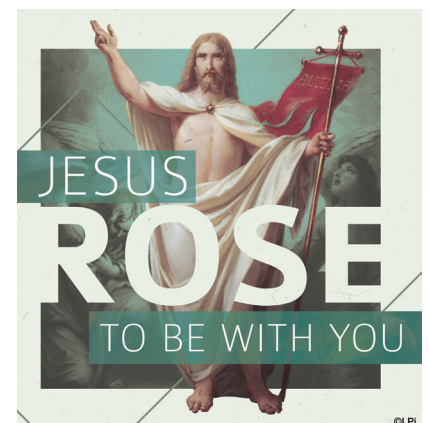

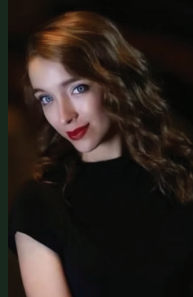

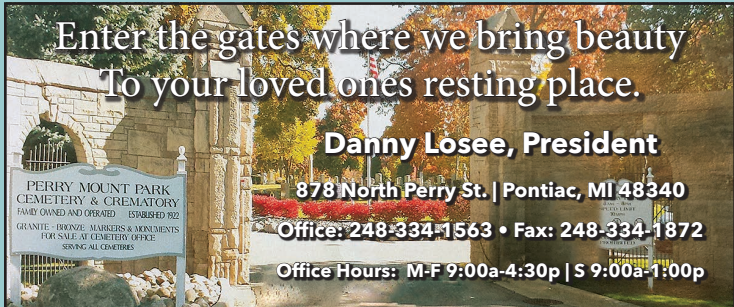
