Embracing the Challenge Restructuring

Hopefully you’re planning to attend the parish **Listening Sessions** coming up on **May 19th** and **21st**, are registered at restructuring.aod.org/, and have begun to explore the information on that website about the process and parishes. Last week I focused on the history that led to the current Restructuring. This week, you’re invited to look to the future, beyond the challenges we face, beyond the uncertainty, beyond potential disappointment, to trust that, strengthened by the Holy Spirit, things will work out for the best for the Church in Detroit. We have every reason to approach the Listening Sessions with charity, to have faith in the transparent process that invites our input, to have hope that good will come in the formation of new pastorates.

The Church always faced challenges and has grown because of them. Martyrdom convinced many of the truth of the Gospel, and the Church grew. Heresies led to councils that clarified understanding of who Jesus is and how the Spirit moves, and unity bloomed. Even the Reformation led to an eventual resurgence of evangelization, deeper appreciation of liturgy and scripture, and growth in spiritual movements. Cultures in every age challenged the Church, even as her positive impact on societies grew.

This Easter, record numbers of people entered the Church in Detroit. We should approach the Restructuring as a positive step toward even further growth in our local Church, building unity among parish communities, marshaling resources to enhance ministries and liturgies, and strengthening opportunities to catechize and evangelize the culture.

Embrace the challenge in your Listening Sessions. Share your opinions with the archbishop. It matters! Contribute your ideas with confidence. Participate in forming vibrant pastorates that will enrich the faith lives of individuals and families, in which priests will flourish and vocations be inspired, and that will grow into thriving, mission-ready communities united in Jesus Christ.

Pray we will all be guided by the Holy Spirit who renews “*the face of the earth.*” Pray our efforts to reimagine parishes as new pastorates will be blessed. Pray for the gifts we need, that we may meet the challenge with wisdom, understanding, and courage. Pray that all decisions will be made in charity. Pray for the intercession of our diocese patron, Ste. Anne, and Mary, Mother of the Church.

Sacramentum Caritatis: Apostolic Exhortation on the “Sacrament of Charity”, the Holy Eucharist

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Distribution & Reception of the Eucharist:

All Christian communities are to observe the current norms [for this ministry] faithfully, seeing in them an expression of the faith and love with which we all must regard this sublime sacrament. Furthermore, the precious time of thanksgiving after communion should not be neglected: besides the singing of an appropriate hymn, it can also be most helpful to remain recollected in silence.

Sacramentum Caritatis 50

PRAY: Throughout the week... Lord Jesus, come! Come to us in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Help us to see, in the norms for the liturgy of this “sublime sacrament” an “expression of faith and love” from and for our Lord. And open our hearts in true thanksgiving after communion, either in song or in silence. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? What is my attitude as I either distribute or receive the Eucharist? Am I careful to observe the “current norms” of this sacrament? Do I see in them an “expression of the faith and love,” and regard this as a “sublime sacrament”? Do I express my thanksgiving in the “precious time” after communion by singing the hymn presented or in silence? Or do I “neglect” it? I will be more intentional and focused on the faith and love expressed, and on my thanksgiving for the gift of this “sublime” Sacrament of the Eucharist.
