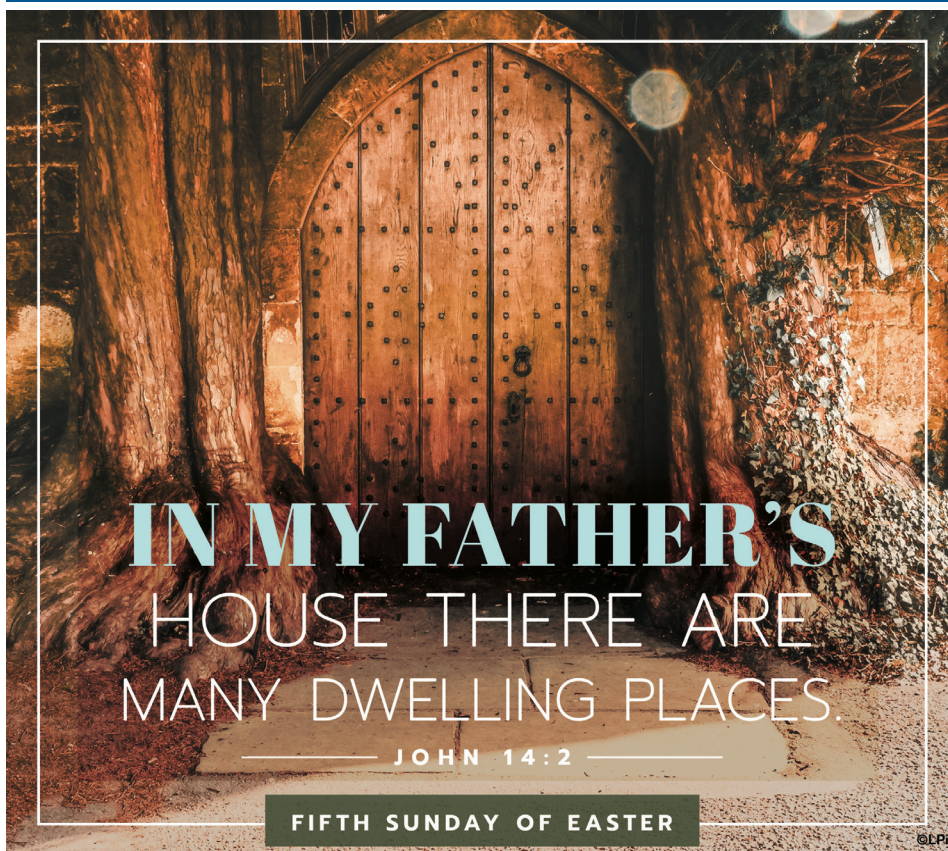

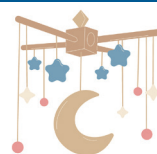

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Easter (It is STILL Easter!) is an opportune time to walk with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. Ready to TAKE another STEP?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The dismissal: "Ite, missa est." I would like to comment briefly on the observations of the Synod Fathers regarding the dismissal at the end of the eucharistic celebration. After the blessing, the deacon or the priest dismisses the people with the words: "Ite, Missa est." These words help us to grasp the relationship between the Mass just celebrated and the mission of Christians in the world. In antiquity, missa simply meant "dismissal." However in Christian usage it gradually took on a deeper meaning. The word "dismissal" has come to imply a "mission."

Sacramentum Caritatis 51

PRAY: Throughout the week... Come Holy Spirit, come! You have shown the Synod Fathers the importance of the dismissal at the end of Mass, and have inspired them to see a relationship "between the Mass just celebrated and the mission of Christians in the world." Reveal to all of us this relationship, so that we may all go on "mission" to take Christ from the Mass out into the world. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to ME? Do I listen as the deacon or priest pronounces the dismissal, either in these words or similar ones? Or am I already gathering my things, putting on my coat, or at least mentally thinking about what comes next in my day? Have I ever considered that this "dismissal" is sending me out into my world to carry Christ to it and the people in it? Can I grasp the "deeper meaning" of these words as they send ME out on mission? At the end of Mass, I will remain, focused as these words are spoken, and consider how I will go out on mission for My Lord Jesus Christ.

Put Your Faith in the Risen Jesus

"From this day forth, you put your faith in me." That is a chilling line spoken by Voldemort near the end of the final film in the *Harry Potter* series. He believes he's won by killing Harry, whose limp body is shown to the crowd. From the start, Voldemort acted with malice and deceit, enslaving followers so that, as he'd said, "only I can live forever." Now he confidently demands allegiance of the whole "wizarding world." Ultimately Voldemort failed for Harry lived.

Not to overstate them, but there are parallels, and contrasts, to what Satan said in the Garden of Eden, and to Jesus in the wilderness, and even to what Satan may have believed as the limp, dead body of Jesus was taken down from the Cross.

Satan lied to claim allegiance from Adam and Eve, promising eternal life when he intended only to keep them from it. He enticed their faith in him by claiming "your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods" (Gen 3:5). Satan similarly tempted Jesus by offering him "all the kingdoms of the world ... and all this power and glory," if Jesus would put faith in and worship Satan (Luke 4:5-8). Unlike Adam and Eve, Jesus refused saying, "You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve." Perhaps Satan gloated when Jesus died on the Cross, believing he had won and could claim our souls. But ultimately, Satan was utterly defeated. Death was not the end for Jesus, nor will it be for those who put their faith in him alone.

Jesus died that our sins may be forgiven and rose that we may have eternal life (John 3:16). In today's Gospel (John 14:1-12), Jesus invites us to put our faith in him. He said "to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me,'" teaching as well how he and the Father are one. Jesus shares his Father's invitation to us to be united with him: "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places ... I am going to prepare a place for you ... [and] I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be." When Thomas, once again expressing his doubts, says, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way and the truth and the life." We must put our faith in Jesus alone, and trust the Covenant promises of the Father, that "everyone who believes in him may have eternal life" (John 3:15).

Alleluia, Jesus Christ is risen from the dead!

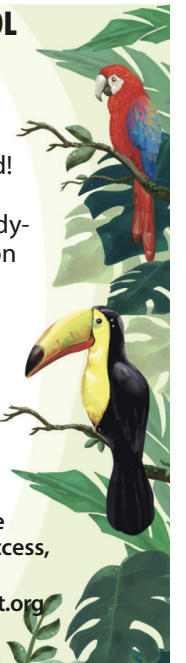

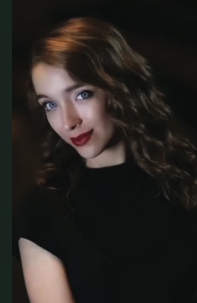
