Manna, Distraction, and the Daily Bread We Need:

So what would it look like if we took the Lord's Prayer literally—"Give us this day our daily bread"—and acted on it?

- *Could you commit once a week (outside Sunday) to attend Mass?
- *Could you stop into a church during your day for five minutes with the Lord?
- * Could you set aside one time during a month for Eucharistic adoration?

Like manna, these moments cannot be "stored up." They are fresh each day, each visit. They build a habit of dependence, a rhythm of trust.

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Easter (It is STILL Easter!) is an opportune time to walk with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. Ready to TAKE another STEP?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

STEP 2 Seek God's BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, to shower BLESSings on your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE .

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

Sacramentum Caritatis: Apostolic Exhortation on the "Sacrament of Charity", the Holy Eucharist

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The dismissal: "Ite, missa est" These few words succinctly express the missionary nature of the Church. The People of God might be helped to understand more clearly this essential dimension of the Church's life, taking the dismissal as a starting-point . . . In this context, the prayer over the people and the final blessing, should be made clear by those announcing it.

Sacramentum Caritatis 51

PRAY: Throughout the week... Come Holy Spirit, come! You have shown the Synod Fathers the importance of the dismissal at the end of Mass, and have inspired them to see this "dismissal as a starting-point." Reveal to all of us this relationship, so that we may all see our leaving Mass as a "starting point" of our "mission" to take Christ out into the world. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I really listen as the deacon or priest pronounces the dismissal, either in these words or similar ones? Do I see this as "an end-point" of the Mass, or as a "starting point" of my mission? Have I ever considered that this "dismissal" is sending me out, with Christ now literally a part of me in the Eucharist, into my world to carry Christ to it and the people in it? At the end of Mass, I will focus as these words are spoken, and consider how I will now "start" to take My Lord Jesus Christ out to those around me.

Anticipating the Holy Spirit by John Hannigan

It is May and Spring is rushing upon us. Following the winds of March and the rains of April, we enjoy days getting longer and (hopefully) warmer, as trees sprout leaves, gardens bloom, and life and light seem to burst suddenly into the world. It is fittingly also a season when the Church focuses our attention on the always-present Holy Spirit. Beginning at the Easter Vigil, we are in the midst of a virtual 'parade' of initiations into the Sacraments. Candidates and the Elect are Baptized. We renew our Baptismal vows. Bishops are going to parishes across the archdiocese to offer Confirmation to teens. Children are coming forward to the altar at Mass to receive First Holy Communion. In each of these Sacraments, there is a powerful descent of the Holy Spirit.

Sunday readings leading up to the celebration of Pentecost focus on the Holy Spirit, often describing the action of the Spirit through the Sacraments in the early Church. In today's first reading (Acts 8:5-8; 14-17), when the apostle Phillip "proclaimed the Christ" people in "Samaria accepted the word of God" and were "baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus." Then Peter and John "prayed for them . . . laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit."

In today's Gospel (John 14:15-21), Jesus makes one of several predictions about the coming of the Holy Spirit: "I will ask the Father and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth . . . You know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you." Jesus also says, "I will not leave you orphans," meaning that by the Spirit received in the Sacraments, we become adopted children of God, brothers and sisters of the Risen Christ who said, "... because I live and you will live . . . you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you."

Our adoption, our redemption, is contingent, of course, for "Jesus said to his disciples: 'If you love me, you will keep my commandments,'" then he will ask the Father to send the Spirit, for "whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me." Peter reminds us that "Christ also suffered for sins once . . . that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit" (1Peter 3:15-18). As we approach Pentecost, recall this powerful "reason for your hope," that by the Grace and gifts of the Holy Spirit that burst upon us in the Sacraments, we can grow in life and light, and love of Jesus Christ.

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2026 (CSA)

The annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2026 is underway. This year's CSA theme comes from the Matthew Gospel 6:21: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be"

These words from our Lord are both tender and challenging. They remind us that our mission flows from the deepest place of our devotion. What we love, we serve. What we treasure, we offer. And when our hearts are rooted in Christ, His mission becomes our mission: to proclaim the Gospel, accompany the suffering, form disciples, and bring the light of His love to every corner of southeast Michigan.

Each of us has received the blessings of time to pray, talents to offer, and material resources to steward. These gifts are never meant to be stored away but should be shared generously, so that through them others may encounter the mercy, hope, and healing that Christ freely gives. Through faithful stewardship, we participate directly in the work of evangelization and build up the Church in ways that extend far beyond what any one of us could accomplish alone.

Through the Catholic Services Appeal more than one hundred services, programs, and ministries provide real and tangible evidence of the power of faith and charity to our community in southeast Michigan. Sharing your treasure makes the evidence known to countless individuals and families.

Our parish's CSA target assigned by Archdiocese of Detroit for 2026 is \$79,353. It is almost \$5000 more than last year. If we exceed our target, 100 percent of the excess will be returned directly to our parish tax free. This makes CSA a great opportunity to give additional gifts to support our parish.

You should have received your CSA mailing from the Archdiocese of Detroit. If not, please contact the parish office or pick up a donation form from the table at the back of the church next weekend.

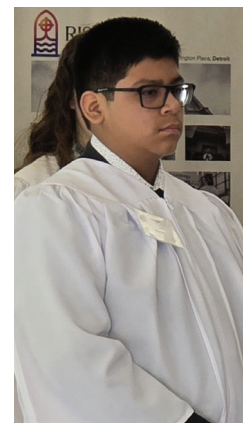

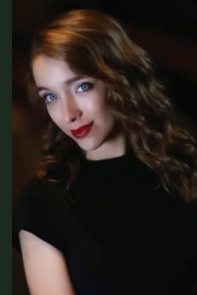

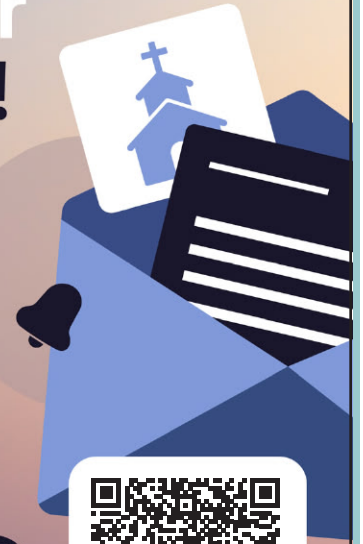
