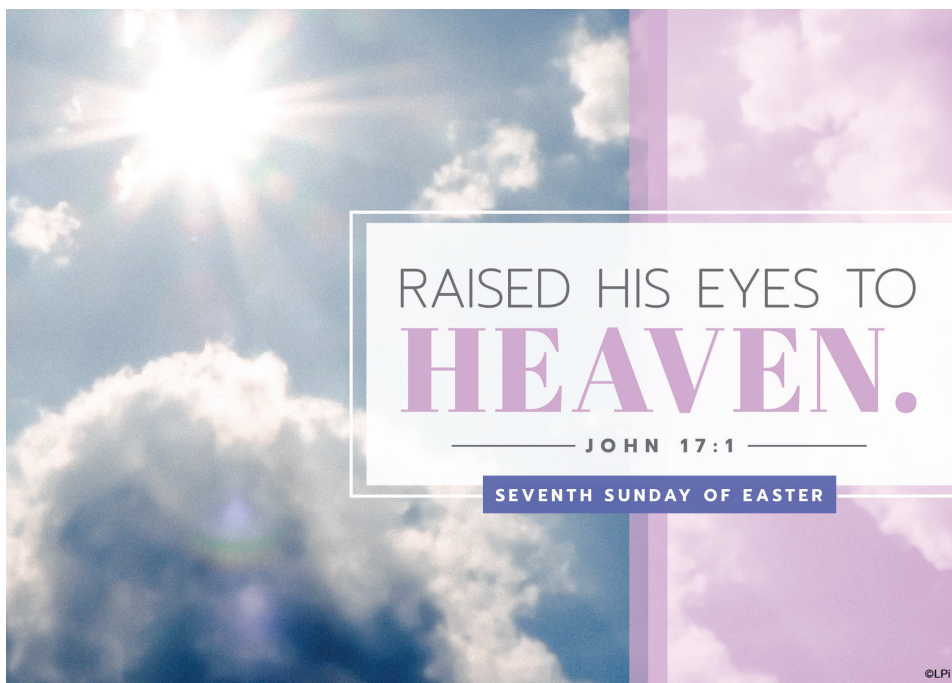

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2026 (CSA)

The annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2026 is underway. This year's CSA theme comes from the Matthew Gospel 6:21: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be"

These words from our Lord are both tender and challenging, reminding us that our mission flows from our love for Christ. What we treasure, we share. Rooted in Him, we are called to proclaim the Gospel, accompany those who suffer, form disciples, and bring His light to southeast Michigan.

Each of us has been blessed with time, talents, and resources meant to be shared generously so others may encounter Christ's mercy, hope, and healing. Through faithful stewardship and the Catholic Services Appeal, more than one hundred ministries and programs continue to bring faith, charity, and support to countless individuals and families throughout southeast Michigan.

Our parish's CSA target assigned by Archdiocese of Detroit for 2026 is \$79,353. It is almost \$5000 more than last year. If we exceed our target, 100 percent of the excess will be returned directly to our parish tax free. This makes CSA a great opportunity to give additional gifts to support our parish.

Receive the Power of the Spirit

Last week I wrote about anticipating the coming of the Holy Spirit. This week's readings about the **Ascension** of Our Lord (Acts 1:1-11; Matt 28:16-20) speak further of Jesus' promised Spirit. We celebrate Christ's glorious return to the Father singing, "*God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord*" (Psalm 47). But imagine how distressing his departure would have been for the disciples who'd spent three years his constant companions. Jesus had chosen them, called them his friends, gave his life for them and, as he prepared to leave, promised further gifts and blessings through the Holy Spirit.

Luke begins the *Acts of the Apostles* (1:1-11) with the Ascension. For 40 days after the resurrection, Christ had "*presented himself alive to*" very many disciples and continued to teach about his kingdom, "*giving instructions through the Holy Spirit*" (Acts 1:5). By the power of the Spirit, the disciples would come to understand more fully what Jesus has said, and would be his "*witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*"

In Paul's letter today (Eph 1:17-23), we hear how he prayed that the blessings of the Holy Spirit would be conferred upon Christians of his day by "*the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory.*" These gifts of power, "*a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him,*" enlighten our hearts with hope that we may receive "*riches of glory,*" our inheritance as God's adopted sons and daughters, as brothers and sisters and friends of Jesus. This inheritance bestowed by the Holy Spirit is of a "*surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe.*"

In the Catholic Tradition the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are **Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear** (or Awe) of the Lord (CCC ¶1831). For Paul (1 Cor 12) and Isaiah (11:2), these powerful gifts also include other blessings in service to the Lord and that benefit his Church, such as faith, healing, prophesy, discernment, strength, and other "*mighty deeds,*" distributed "*individually to each person as the Spirit wishes.*"

In these last days of the Easter Season leading up to Pentecost, wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit, pray for an onrushing of the gifts of the Spirit for yourself, your friends and family, our parishes, our Archdiocese, and the whole Church.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Authentic Participation—The Second Vatican Council rightly emphasized the active, full and fruitful participation of the entire People of God in the eucharistic celebration. . . We must not overlook the fact that some misunderstanding has occasionally arisen concerning the precise meaning of this participation. It should be made clear that the word "participation" does not refer to mere external activity during the celebration. In fact, the active participation called for by the Council must be understood . . . on the basis of a greater awareness of the mystery being celebrated and its relationship to daily life.

PRAY: Throughout the week... *Come Holy Spirit, come! Inspire us in our "participation" during Mass as the Council Fathers intended. Open our hearts and minds as well as our mouths as we give You right praise and adoration. Protect us from distraction and interruption which would interfere with our "greater awareness of the mystery being celebrated." And open our eyes to see its "relationship to daily life." Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I "participate" in the Mass? What does my participation look like? Do I sing and pray the prayers, or just mumble along, or even stay silent? Do I actively consider or try to understand what the words are saying in song, prayer or Scripture, or am I repeating by rote, distracted by my surroundings or plans? Am I really engaged mentally and spiritually in the Mass, especially during the Consecration of the Eucharist, or, is it a "mere external activity"? I will pray before Mass for the Holy Spirit to enliven my heart and mind to "participate" more "actively", with "greater awareness of the mystery being celebrated." And when I find myself getting distracted, will pray again for the Grace to lift up my "participation" to see "its relationship to my daily life." Come Holy Spirit!
