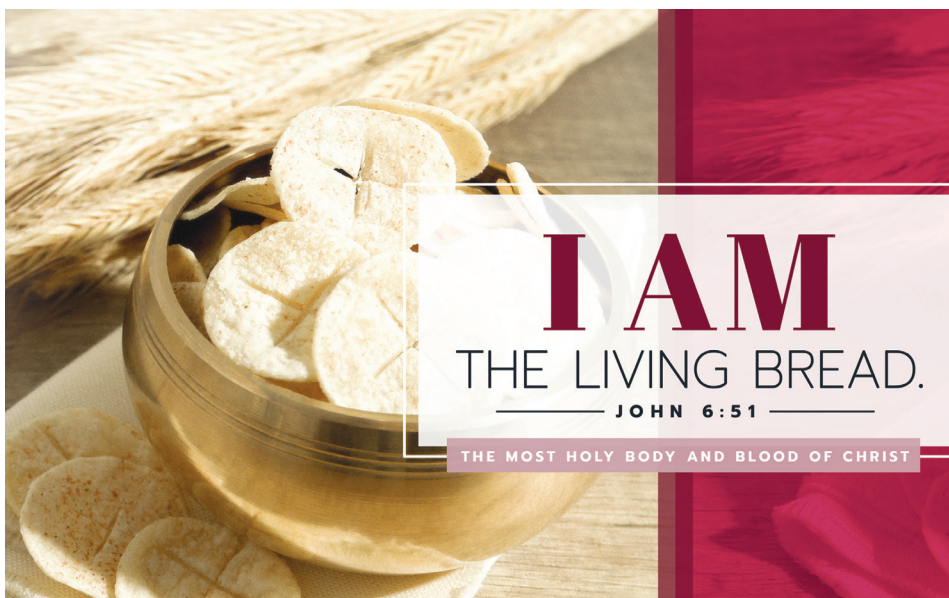

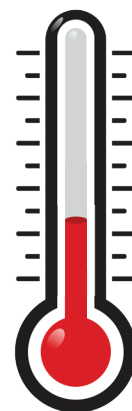


## CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL 2026 (CSA)

## NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my  
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

**Being a Missionary Disciple:** That means I need to be prepared to give my testimony to my ONE, or others. That's scary—how do I prepare? Simply put, this is a matter of intentionality. Remember, God gives us what we need, to do what He wants us to do? Ask the Lord in prayer to help you connect your beliefs to events and experiences you've had. Ask simply—"Lord, help me remember any events or experiences that have led me to know you more fully, or understand this part of my faith better." Take notes—maybe in a journal. And return to them occasionally during your daily prayer time. Or take it before the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. It's less about remembering events exactly, as it is about seeing them at an increasingly deep level, recognizing in them your growing intimacy with Christ. In time, you will recognize it as your faith "story," in other words, your testimony.

**LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI:** Participation and the priestly ministry—The beauty and the harmony of the liturgy find eloquent expression in the order by which everyone is called to participate actively. This entails an acknowledgement of the distinct hierarchical roles involved in the celebration. It is helpful to recall that active participation is not per se equivalent to the exercise of a specific ministry. There is particular need for clarity with regard to the specific functions of the [priest, Bishop, deacon, and ministries by trained laity].

**PRAY: Throughout the week . . .** Come Holy Spirit, come! Open our hearts to appreciate the "beauty and the harmony" of the liturgy. Reveal to us the "eloquent expression" in the order of the Mass in which we are called to "participate actively." Help us to see clearly the distinct function of each of the "hierarchical roles" in the celebration, which are apart from our individual active participation. Amen!

**ASK & ACT:** What are these words saying to ME? How can I more appreciate the "beauty and the harmony" of the liturgy? Can I see how the very "order" by which we participate contributes to those? Can I see how the "hierarchical roles" and ministries of those leading the celebration contributes to them also? I will continue to study (in the next few weeks) the various roles and how they contribute to the overall beauty and harmony of the Mass.

## Treasuring the Body of Christ

The Church grew quickly and thrived in Japan after St. Francis Xavier arrived in 1540. But in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, Catholics came under fierce attack from powerful shoguns. Persecution included the crucifixion of dozens of Jesuit and Franciscan missionary priests. Their martyrdom meant surviving Christians were left without access to the Eucharist. On this *Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)*, consider what the most Blessed Sacrament meant to them then, and to us now. Author Ross McCullough tells the story of what Catholics in Japan did after their priests were killed:

*"The lay people had spirited away some fragments of the Eucharist, and they would distribute them throughout the congregation during their secret gatherings . . . but slowly the fragments dwindled . . . They subdivided the host f or as long as they could, but soon faced a choice: preserve some part of the whole Christ to worship, or consume forever his physical presence among them in one last breaking of the fast. Which would you choose?"*

Preserving the host, keeping Jesus truly, really present among them, seemed reasonable to those Catholics in Japan. They knew *who* the host was, as Jesus says in today's Gospel, and throughout John, Chapter 6: **"I am the living bread that came down from heaven."** But, McCullough asks, "how to bear up month after month and year after year under such persecution without the sustenance that the host is after all instituted to provide!" If you were the custodian of the last fragment of the Sacrament, would you hold onto him as a sacred treasure, or consume him? For Jesus said, **"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man . . . you do not have life within you."** Yet knowing that whoever eats his flesh will have eternal life, how could you *not* consume Jesus? Which would you choose?

In 1690s Japan, a Catholic woman, just before she was martyred, consumed the last fragment to protect Christ from desecration. Today, the Body of Christ is still under attack. New laws try to strip our right to freely exercise our faith. In Nigeria, priests are often being killed and churches desecrated and burned down. Be grateful for our ready access to the Eucharist and for the powerful witness of the martyrs . . . yesterday and today.

## IN CONSIDERATION OF RESTRUCTURING CHANGES...

As we are in the Restructuring phase of the Archdiocese of Detroit, and we have been presented with information including 4 possible models of restructuring parishes due to decreased availability of priests we are called to reflect and consider if any of the 4 models seems the best answer or if we can offer additional input for another parish model. It is incumbent upon us to prepare for change. Among the changes we have already made, is the Family of Parishes. These 5 parishes are already working together to deliver Masses, Reconciliation, Faith Formation, and more. Yet, here we are again, considering additional change. We are privileged to be made aware of and invited to contribute input before additional changes occur. Even with the 20% increase of registered members of our congregation at Sacred Heart it is important to understand that Mass can be attended at any parish. Attendance at Masses here is not the only consideration as restructuring is decided. For a community to thrive it is necessary for its members to participate in more than Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. The possibility that members of Sacred Heart will need to choose another location to worship at Mass could become a reality due to the fact that other parish communities are engaging their members in more activities of service, education, and growth of faithful living as a community.

We share this information with you because we do not want negative outcomes due to a perceived lack of information. That is to say, we trust that the Restructuring process will be designed to provide the most benefit to the greatest number of our members/parishes. It would be greatly disappointing if our members at Sacred Heart did not feel their needs are recognized. Therefore, if you feel that you are doing all that you can or should to support the community at Sacred Heart, know that you are blessed.

If, however, you have considered but have not acted upon increased participation at Sacred Heart, **now is the time.** Opportunities available to each of us include:

## GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER

### UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

When I was a young altar server, I once overheard two very different comments about the Eucharist. One person asked, "Is Father distributing the bread or the wine?" Later, another asked, "Can you go get Jesus from the tabernacle?" Same parish, same Mass, but two very different ways of speaking. I pondered: So, is it bread that we pretend is Jesus? Or is Jesus a tiny white thing in a box? I was utterly confused.

This Feast of Corpus Christi is an excellent time to think about how we should speak about the Eucharist. In today's Gospel, Jesus declares: "My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." (John 6:55) His words scandalized his listeners, who feared cannibalism, and even today

puzzle many, who reduce them to metaphor. Both miss the truth.

The Church gives us better words that honor Jesus' words in the Gospel. After the consecration, we do not call it "bread" or "wine." Nor do we say, "a piece of Jesus" or even "Jesus." We say: the Eucharist. We say: the Body and Blood of Christ. We say: the Real Presence. We say: the Most Blessed Sacrament. These words safeguard the astonishing reality that Christ himself is truly present, whole and entire, under the appearances of bread and wine.

If we speak well about the Eucharist, we will think more clearly and believe more deeply. And if we believe more deeply, we will adore more truly the One who gives himself to us — not bread, not wine, but Jesus Christ himself, whole and entire.

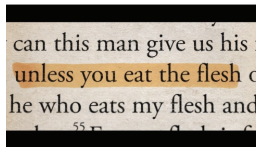

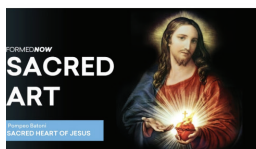
**Bread of Life: The Eucharist in Galilee**

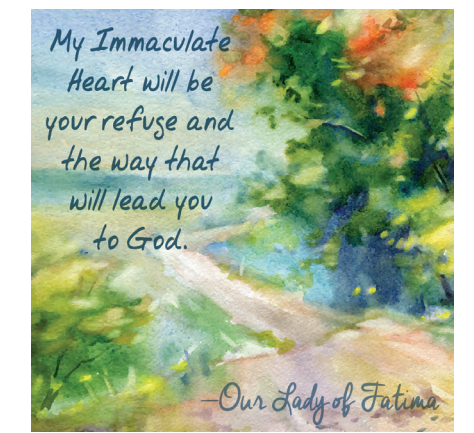

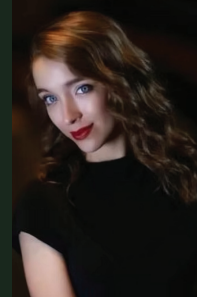

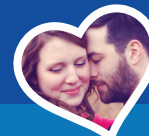
