Being a Missionary Disciple: Now, I've prepared my "story," my testimony, by remembering past experiences that led me closer to Christ. But how do I know when it's the right time to share this testimony with my ONE? I must start with PRAYER, even before being with him/her. I ask the Lord to guide my conversation and give me the opportunity and the words to say what He wants me to say. I ask for the Grace to love as He loves. And then it's time to OBSERVE and LISTEN. What is appropriate for the situation? Can I ask a question of my ONE before sharing and then LISTEN? For example: "When you grew up Catholic" or "As you were growing up"—what was your experience like with Catholics or the Church? This can open the door for you to share your testimony as part of a conversation. If I'm really bold, I will ask God to help me to speak of my love for Him in front of my ONE. Stay tuned—there's more to come!

Summer Reading – 2026

Summer often grants us a little time apart from the rigors of everyday obligations to spend a few hours in the shade reading a good book. For the past several years I've recommended mostly novels, often classics, but sometimes poetry, that might inspire, challenge and entertain, and that may reveal a Catholic/Christian view, even if by contrast.

I recently came across a wonderful writer with a unique captivating style. I don't know how I missed Cormac McCarthy for so many years, when he was well known for **No Country for Old Men** (2005). I have not read that one and can only recommend the one by McCarthy I did read:

- **The Road** (2006), a suspense-filled story of a father and young son traveling through the desolate aftermath of nuclear holocaust. Yet the novel is infused with courage and hope.

The Road called to mind other highly regarded "post-apocalyptic" or dystopian novels well worth reading or re-reading. These genres can come across as despairing of mankind's future, but they remind us of potent social, political and technological challenges we face, forces that faith can counter. Consider the classics:

- **Brave New World** (1932) by Aldous Huxley
- **1984** (1949) by George Orwell
- **Fahrenheit 451** (1953) by Ray Bradbury

Or the less well-known:

- **A Canticle for Liebowitz** (1959) by Walter M. Miller, a story set during the collapse of American society and institutions after nuclear war. Only the Catholic Church survives... sort of.
- **The Stand** (1978) by Steven King
- **That Hideous Strength** (1945) by C.S. Lewis

These two explicitly depict the constant, often hidden battle between good and raw evil, between Christianity and demonic forces. In these novels, the *real* battle, the spiritual one, is exposed after social order collapses, due either to a world-wide plague (King) or a local corruption of academia (Lewis).

I invite you to pick up a good book or two, these or others. Be entertained and enlightened by Truths revealed in character, motive, plot and action. Pick one and enjoy! I also invite your suggestions for other good books, of any genre. Let me know what you think, and what other works you'd recommend.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Participation and the Priestly Ministry: The Priest, he alone and no other, as the tradition of the Church attests, presides over the entire eucharistic celebration, from the initial greeting to the final blessing. In virtue of his reception of Holy Orders, he represents Jesus Christ, the head of the church, and, in a specific way, also the Church herself. Every celebration of the Eucharist, in fact, is led by the Bishop, "either in person or through priests who are his helpers."

Sacramentum Caritatis 53

PRAY: Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, open our hearts to appreciate and recognize the importance of the priest who "alone presides over the entire eucharistic celebration." May we see Christ in him as "he represents Jesus Christ, the head of the church, and the Church herself." And may we also always give thanks for the Bishop who is, in person or through the help of the priests, in fact leading us in the Mass. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? How can I more appreciate the ministry of the priests and Bishop at the Masses I attend? Can I see Christ working in and through the priest who, by his having received Holy Orders, leads the "entire eucharistic celebration"? Have I attended a Mass where the Bishop (or Archbishop) have celebrated the Mass, and did I understand that he leads all the Masses in the diocese whether in person or through "priests who are his helpers"? I will continue to study (in the next weeks) the various liturgical roles and how they contribute to the overall beauty and harmony of the Mass.

GOSPEL MEDITATION ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

A few years ago, I met a woman in my parish who was a successful lawyer. Yet in her free time, she poured her energy into a nonprofit she founded to advocate for children with special needs. When I asked what inspired her, she spoke of her niece, who was born with disabilities. Her niece was both a glorious gift and a constant challenge. Out of that painful, beautiful experience, she felt called to create something lasting for other children and parents. The nonprofit thrived, not because she had mapped it all out, but because she was deeply moved to act.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is "moved with compassion" for the crowd, for they were "like sheep without a shepherd." (Matthew 9:36) So he calls his disciples, ordinary men with no special qualifications, and sends them to heal, preach, and cast out demons. Their mission flows not from their skills but from his authority and the Spirit's gifts.

The Second Vatican Council teaches that the Spirit continually pours out charisms, special graces for the good of the Church and the world (cf. Lumen Gentium 4 & 12). These often arise from the unfolding of our lives: from what breaks your heart, what fills you with hope, what suffering has shaped you. The Spirit works through those very experiences to equip us with gifts that build up others.

What is your charism? Well, what needs around you call you to loving action? This could be where Christ is sending you. Allow your heart to be moved like Christ's. Then get to work.



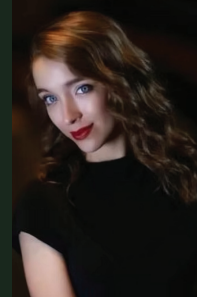

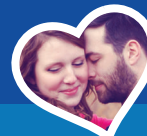
