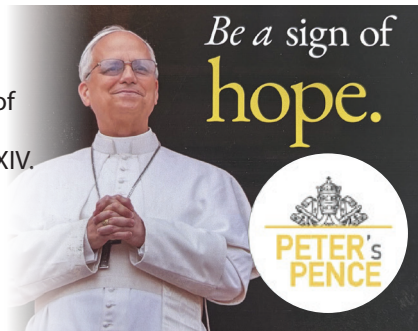

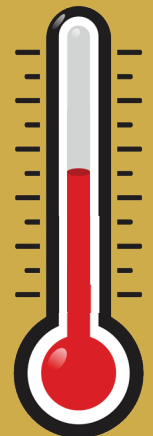

## NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my  
flesh for the life of the world.*

*John 6:51*

**Being a Missionary Disciple:** Now, I've prepared my "story," my testimony, by remembering past experiences that led me closer to Christ. Now how do I share my story (testimony) without it feeling awkward or weird? There are three areas to focus on here:

- 1) **Format**, 2) **Tone**, and 3) **Length**. As for format, simply state the following: What was true before the experience/event. Then what happened? And what changed after? We'll continue next week.

Associated with these ministries linked to the sacrament of Holy Orders, there are also other ministries of liturgical service which can be carried to in a praiseworthy manner by religious and properly trained laity.

**ASK & ACT:** What are these words saying to **ME**? How can I more appreciate the ministries of the Bishop, priest, deacon, religious and laity who celebrate the Masses I attend? Can I see Christ working in and through them? I will continue to study and ask God for the Grace to see His work in and through the various liturgical roles and how they contribute to the overall beauty and harmony of the Mass.

## Saint Thomas More

The main character in a popular novel and TV series, *Wolf Hall*, was Thomas Cromwell, a minister to King Henry VIII. Cromwell is portrayed as a "hero" of the English Reformation, a characterization that struck me as taking too much license with history given his vigorous political and religious opposition to St. Thomas More whose memorial is June 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Cromwell was an architect of Henry's strategies to have his marriage to Catherine of Aragon annulled. When the pope rejected annulment, Henry declared himself supreme head of the Church in England. Cromwell ruthlessly enforced compliance with the *Oath of Succession* which required subjects to swear Henry's marriage to Anne Boleyn was licit and his authority over the Church in England absolute.

Though taking the *Oath* meant separating oneself from the Church, many Church and government officials did. But Thomas More refused and was ostracized for it though he was loyal to Henry (to a point), a respected lawyer, member of Parliament, and eventually Lord Chancellor. More refused because he was a faithful layman, a solid witness to the faith, and a truly heroic example of being righteously engaged in public service. A man of integrity, a *Man for All Seasons*, More felt obligated to resign his office. He was beheaded in 1535 because he chose to hold fast to his Catholic faith.

We may see parallels today with how politicians demand allegiance to parties, policies or personalities over principles. Following More's example means acting rightly and not cooperating with evil. It means choosing to follow the teachings of Jesus and his Church. More did not die in defense of some vague "personal conscience" (e.g., thinking you have a *right* to think whatever you think is right). Rather, his choices were based on a "well formed" conscience, meaning he acted consistent with God's Law. This is why More could not – in *good* conscience – conform to Henry's authority or Cromwell's pressures. At his execution Thomas More told the crowd, "I am the King's good servant – but God's first."

St. Thomas More is a worthy model today. He never lost his bearings in a culture suffering upheaval. Despite the challenges in his time, he remained firmly rooted in sound principles and faithful to the one true King of Kings.

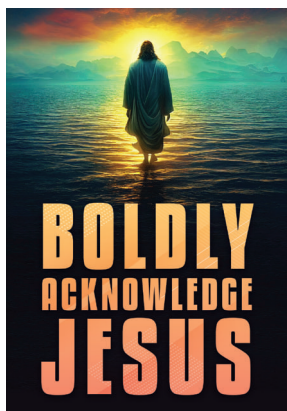

# National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children

### OUR FIVE UNBORN CHILDREN OF GOD

"In 1980, the bodies of 5 pre-born infants were found in Oakland County. Four bodies, found in a self serve storage locker, were said to be 5 months or less in gestation. The fifth child found in a plastic container behind a medical clinic, was found to be approximately 8 months in gestation.

"It was felt by Right to Life - LIFESPAN that a more fitting place of the bodies was imperative. These children were not able to experience their right to life and we felt that at least, in death, their humanity should be recognized and burial be provided as should and would be provided for any other member of our human family.

"Through the courtesy of A. J. Desmond and Sons, Funeral Directors, and White Chapel Cemetery, the bodies of these preborn children were laid to rest in a brief and simple ceremony on May 2, 1980."

In 2020, we gave our babies names: Anthony, John, Joseph, Grace & Mary.

On Saturday, September 12<sup>th</sup>, LIFESPAN will join other Pro-Life Americans across the country to honor the memory of 63,000,000 pre-born victims of abortion during the National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children.

National Day of Remembrance is a joint project of Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, Priests for Life, and the Pro-Life Action League.

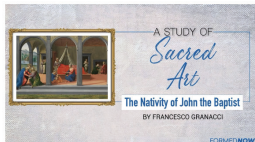

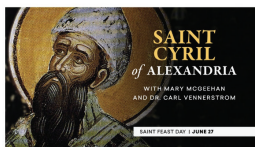

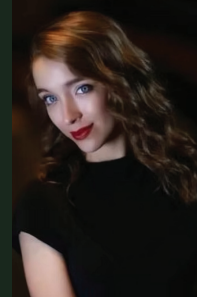
