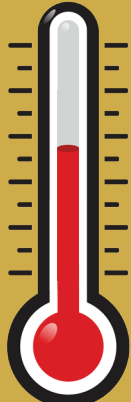

Discipleship of Restructuring

Being a Missionary Disciple: Now, I've prepared my "story," my testimony. How do I share it? The three things to consider are **Format**, **2) Tone**, and **3) Length**. We've considered format. What about **Tone**? I must be sure the tone is sincere—not condescending. You have had a life-changing experience that you want to share. Just be you.

(National Eucharistic Congress)

In recent weeks, people crowded into parish halls across the Archdiocese (AOD) for Listening Sessions. Some are troubled by the uncertainty of pastorate models that mean buildings might close. Others feel they are being abandoned. Matthew 9:36-10:8 seems to sympathize with people who worry about the impact of Restructuring. We hear the tenderness of Jesus: "At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd." He responded by sending disciples to seek "the lost" and proclaim "The kingdom of heaven."

It is a difficult time for the AOD, but it would be a pity to lose heart. There is reason for optimism in realigning parishes to support priests and gather, together, into new, vibrant, mission-ready congregations. We ought to be hopeful. Archbishop Weisenberger invited us to participate in an amazingly transparent process. He shared extensive information about the history, make-up, sacramental trends and finances of every parish. Scribes sent your initial Listening Session comments on draft models – pros and cons – to the archbishop. Now he encourages you to study and reflect further. Use the online survey to explain, in concrete terms, **why** you think one model would work, **why** you think another would not, **why** you think a specific, different arrangement makes even more sense.

Sound discipleship in the context of Restructuring includes praying for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in discerning the best way forward. Charitably engaging the process, sharing opinions and helping others meet the challenges ahead would be acting as disciples striving to grow the Catholic Church in the AOD. Recall the original foundational conviction of **Unleash the Gospel**: "to undergo a 'missionary conversion,' a change in our culture, such that every person at every level of the Church . . . is formed and sent forth as a joyful missionary disciple." The present "renewal of structures" anticipated in **Unleash the Gospel** means embracing our roles as disciples within the Restructuring, helping new pastorate become "Spirit-led and radically mission-oriented" communities where people are drawn anew to Encounter Jesus, Grow in faith, and become vibrant Witnesses proclaiming the Kingdom.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: The Eucharistic celebration and inculturation: . . . The Synod Fathers frequently stressed the importance of the active participation of the faithful in the eucharistic sacrifice. In order to foster this participation, provision may be made for a number of adaptations appropriate to different contexts and cultures . . . In the mystery of the Incarnation, the Lord Jesus, born of a woman and fully human, entered directly into a relationship not only with the expectations present within the Old Testament, but also with those of all peoples. He thus showed that God wishes to encounter us in our own concrete situation.

Sacramentum Caritatis 54

PRAY: *Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, help us to see the importance of our participation in the "eucharistic sacrifice." Increase our understanding of the "mystery of the Incarnation"—that our Lord Jesus was born of a woman" and is, therefore, fully human while also fully divine. Open our hearts to receive Him in the Eucharist as "an encounter in our own concrete situation." Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I honestly participate "fully" in the "eucharistic sacrifice"? Or am I distracted, or possibly just going through the motions? Do I feel the wonder of the "mystery of the Incarnation" that Jesus is fully human and fully divine, and yet I actually take Him into myself so He becomes one with me, and I become one with Him—an "encounter in MY own concrete situation"? I will ask the Holy Spirit to enkindle in me the wonder of such a mystery the next time I receive communion.

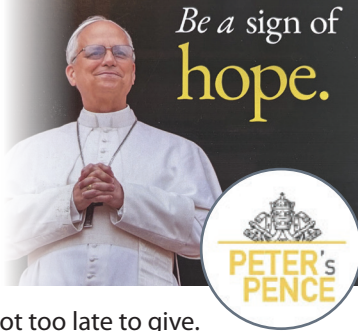

OUR FIVE UNBORN CHILDREN OF GOD

"In 1980, the bodies of 5 pre-born infants were found in Oakland County. Four bodies, found in a self-serve storage locker, were said to be 5 months or less in gestation. The fifth child found in a plastic container behind a medical clinic, was found to be approximately 8 months in gestation.

"It was felt by Right to Life - LIFESPAN that a more fitting place of the bodies was imperative. These children were not able to experience their right to life and we felt that at least, in death, their humanity should be recognized and burial be provided as should and would be provided for any other member of our human family.

"Through the courtesy of A. J. Desmond and Sons, Funeral Directors, and White Chapel Cemetery, the bodies of these preborn children were laid to rest in a brief and simple ceremony on May 2, 1980."
