LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Personal conditions for an "active participation":

Clearly, full participation in the Eucharist takes place when the faithful approach the altar in person to receive communion. Yet true as this is, care must be taken lest they conclude that the mere fact of their being present in church during the liturgy gives them a right or even an obligation to approach the table of the eucharist. Even in cases where it is not possible to receive sacramental communion, participation at Mass remains necessary, important, meaningful and fruitful.

PRAY: *Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, create in me the desire to participate in the Mass, even if for some reason I cannot partake of the Eucharist. Help me to fully understand that I have no "right or obligation" to receive the Eucharist just because I am present. Enliven in me the understanding that just my presence at Mass is "necessary, important, meaningful and fruitful." Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I attend Mass out of obligation or entitlement? If I am there, do I think I have a "right" to receive the Eucharist, even if there is some reason that I should not? Do I understand that just my presence is important to our Lord—it is "necessary, important, meaningful and fruitful?" Lord, make it so in me.

Wisdom in Archdiocesan Restructuring

Today we hear how Solomon was favored by God because he asked for wisdom, "an understanding heart" that he might know what is right and how to act for the good of his people (1 Kings 3:5-12). In the midst of the Archdiocesan Restructuring we should pray for nothing less than great wisdom for Archbishop Weisenburger. It falls to him to decide how best to form new pastorates of our parishes. Indeed, our *Prayer for Restructuring* invokes the Holy Spirit, appealing in particular for the gift of Wisdom:

"Come, Holy Spirit. Make your presence known . . . Be our light on the path we walk together . . . Give us clarity, understanding, and direction . . ."

To his credit, the Archbishop is relying not only on divine inspiration but also on the comments and opinions of priests, deacons, parish leaders and each one of us. That prayer to the Holy Spirit also says:

"Help us hear your voice in the quiet of our own hearts, in the wisdom of others, and in the world around us."

Coming to well-informed decisions for the good of all is the whole point of making readily available to us detailed information about every parish and holding hundreds of Listening Sessions. While those sessions are over, the listening continues! Fill out the online survey. It remains open until July 31st.

You have an opportunity to share your wisdom with the archbishop. **Your feedback is essential.** Pray before filling out the survey. Watch or re-watch the videos describing the models for the parish. Review the parish Workbooks and model pastorates.

Everyone loves their parish. Nobody wants theirs to close. Beyond extolling the virtues of your parish, share what pastorate you think works best **and why**. Describe **why** you think other models would not work well. Or propose a different pastorate and explain **why** you think that would work even better.

Sometimes we find it desirable, even necessary, to give up something great to receive or achieve something greater. That is Jesus' Gospel message today in his analogies of the Kingdom of Heaven (Matthew 13:44-52). One person, "out of joy," sells all he has to get a buried treasure. A merchant "sells all that he has," to buy "a pearl of great price." Where is the pearl of a pastorate model? Which version of restructuring is the hidden treasure? O Holy Spirit, grant us and our archbishop the Wisdom to know.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Around the time that the gold rushes ended in the nineteenth-century West, a curious phenomenon arose in New England known as money diggers. These were men who roamed the countryside with shovels, divining rods, and superstitious hope, convinced that treasure lay buried beneath their feet. Surely there must be gold under our feet. But there was not. The craze of these wild goose chases caused many to lose farms, families, and sanity.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus inaugurates a new era of spiritual money digging. He announces, **"The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field."** He invites us to become treasure seekers who search in the right place. What is of greatest value is not money beneath our feet, but the infinite treasure hidden deep in the humanity of Jesus himself, God's own blessed life. The glory of heaven lies veiled in his ordinary life, his teaching, his suffering, his Church.

This teaching about the Kingdom changes things. Now we see the Church's doctrinal and moral teachings are not arbitrary rules. They are a treasure map. Follow them, and we will uncover divine happiness. Ignore them, and we will wander aimlessly, spade in hand, digging in empty fields, discouraged.

Where have we wasted energy seeking treasure in the wrong places? How have we given up on seeking the treasure of truly finding God's love for us? If so, let us repent of both. Then let us dust off our shovels and get back to digging deep into the field of Christ Jesus and his Church. After all, He never ceases seeking his treasure in us.

OUR FIVE UNBORN CHILDREN OF GOD

"In 1980, the bodies of 5 pre-born infants were found in Oakland County. Four bodies, found in a self-serve storage locker, were said to be 6 months or less in gestation. The fifth child found in a plastic container behind a medical clinic, was found to be approximately 8 months in gestation.

"It was felt by Right to Life - LIFESPAN that a more fitting place of the bodies was imperative. These children were not able to experience their right to life and we felt that at least, in death, their humanity should be recognized and burial be provided as should and would be provided for any other member of our human family.

"Through the courtesy of A. J. Desmond and Sons, Funeral Directors, and White Chapel Cemetery, the bodies of these preborn children were laid to rest in a brief and simple ceremony on May 2, 1980."

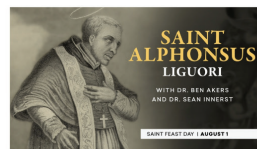
The Violinist: Stories of Solanus Casey

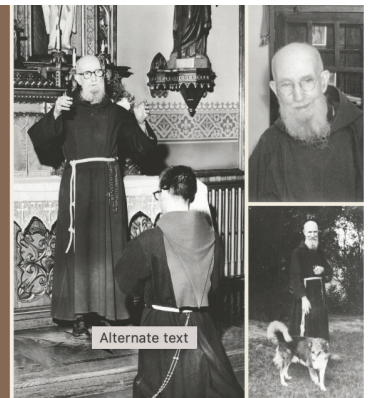

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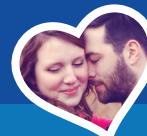


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
