NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

Being a Missionary Disciple: As a Missionary Disciple, I am encouraged to share the **kerygma** (**kuh-rig-muh**) with others—walk with my ONE. Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the “Good News. But how can I effectively share it today in my everyday life? As Christ did—with patience, mercy, and love of neighbor, all while remaining firm in sharing the truth and calling others to more. This is the balance of sharing the kerygma while effectively accompanying others. To do this, there are seven (7) steps . . .

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKEBLESSBREAKGIVE

Summer may be an opportune time to walk (literally?) with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. Ready to TAKE another STEP?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

STEP 2 Seek God’s BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, to shower BLESSings on your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE.

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Personal conditions for an “active participation”:

The subject of participation in the eucharist inevitably raises the question of Christians belonging to Churches or Ecclesial Communities not in full communion [*i.e. unity of belief that the bread and wine offered at Mass are changed really and truly into the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ*] with the Catholic Church. In this regard, it must be said that the intrinsic link between the Eucharist and the church’s unity inspires us to long for the day when we will be able to celebrate the Holy Eucharist together with all believers in Christ, and in this way to express visibly the fullness of unity that Christ willed for his disciples. [*Saying “Amen” at receiving, “The Body of Christ,” means, “I agree.”*] On the other hand, the respect we owe to the sacrament of Christ’s Body and Blood, prevents us from making it a mere “means” to be used indiscriminately in order to attain that unity.

Sacramentum Caritatis 56

PRAY: Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, create in me, and all those who believe in Jesus Christ as Savior, the desire to be one with each other as we are one in Christ in seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, so that we may all participate fully in the Holy Eucharist. Until that day, may we pray for understanding and acceptance of this most holy and central teaching of the Church, and that all disciples will be united in this belief. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Have I ever encountered, or do I know someone who wants to take Communion in the Catholic Church but is not “allowed”? Have I investigated so I can explain why to them, or is it just a “rule” to follow? I will re-read the explanation above and attempt to understand, doing more research if necessary, or talking to someone like a priest or deacon who could explain it better to me. I want to be prepared to explain it more mercifully and lovingly to someone who asks.

AN INVITATION TO OCIA: WHAT IT IS AND WHO IT’S FOR

OCIA, the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, is a welcoming way of formation and preparation for people thinking about entering the Catholic Church. It is for people who are wondering and inquiring about Christ’s Church, who may be seeking more meaning in their lives, or a deeper understanding of Creation, human nature and Truth.

OCIA is for adults from all backgrounds, at any stage in their faith lives, people with no specific faith tradition, and people who practiced another religion . . . a Protestant sect, an Eastern faith, or Islam. OCIA is also for adult Catholics who were baptized but had not received other *Sacraments of Initiation*, First Communion and/or Confirmation. OCIA also appeals to Catholics who have been away from the Church, and to practicing Catholics who wish to learn more about their faith or who want to accompany others on their journey into the Church.

In cooperation with Deacon Michael Stach at Sacred Heart parish, and Curtis Scheulke, Director of Religious Education at St. Thomas More, I will again be coordinating OCIA jointly for both parishes this year. Topics are wide-ranging, rooted in Scripture, focus on Jesus, cover much of Church teachings and practices, especially the Sacraments. Sessions are also guided by the participants’ interests and questions. The format for most sessions uses a beautifully produced video followed by open discussion. OCIA is a prayerful guide for inquiry, self-examination and growth. For participants who are prepared, OCIA culminates with entrance into full communion with the Church by reception of Sacraments of Initiation at the Great Easter Vigil in March.

Everyone is encouraged to invite people they think might be curious about the Church and would enjoy OCIA to consider participating this year. (Some of you might consider joining OCIA with friends and family as a sponsor.) Encourage folks to find out more by reaching out to anyone on our OCIA team, or their priests or deacons, to learn more. Weekly sessions on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00 pm begin September 22nd.

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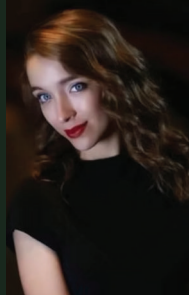
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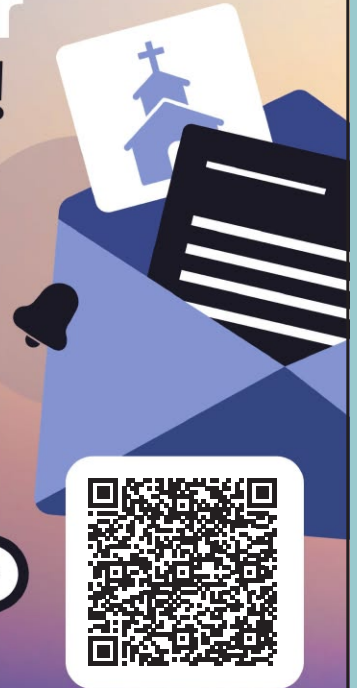
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
