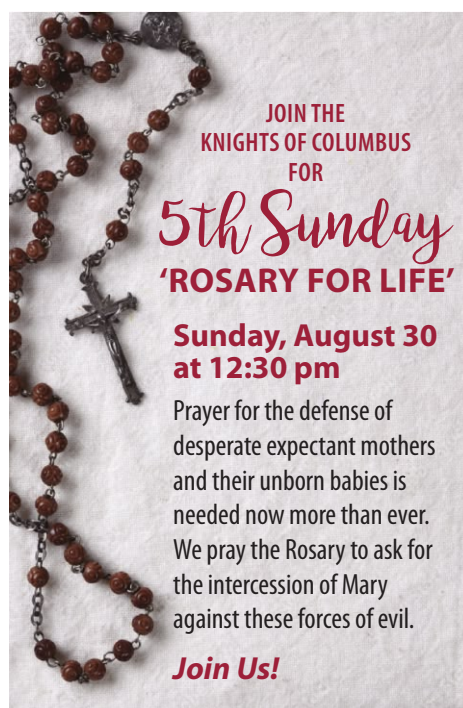

Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News to walk with your ONE: Seven (7) Practical steps: 1. Start with Prayer 2. Build a connection; 3. Share your experience; 4. Use clear, simple language; 5. Introduce to community; 6. Encourage participation; 7. Be patient yet persistent. Ready for Step 1? ...

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Summer may be an opportune time to walk (literally?) with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. Ready to TAKE another STEP?

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Personal conditions for an "active participation":

The respect we owe to the sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood, prevents us from making it a mere "means" to be used indiscriminately in order to attain [the desired unity]. The Eucharist in fact not only manifests our personal communion with Jesus Christ, but also implies full *communio* with the Church [what "Amen" means when we receive]. This is the reason why, sadly albeit not without hope, we ask Christians who are not Catholic to understand and respect our conviction, which is grounded in the Bible and Tradition.

PRAY: Throughout the week ... Come Holy Spirit, create in me, and all those who believe in Jesus Christ as Savior, the desire to be one with each other as we are one in Christ in seeking full communion with the Catholic Church, so that we may all participate fully in the Holy Eucharist. Until that day, may we pray for understanding of and respect for this most holy and central teaching of the Church, and hope for the day when all disciples will be united in this belief. Amen!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Have I ever encountered, or do I know someone who wants to take Communion in the Catholic Church but is not "allowed"? Have I investigated so I can explain why to them, or is it just a "rule" to follow? I will study and attempt to understand, doing more research if necessary, or talking to someone like a priest or deacon who could explain it better to me so I will be prepared to explain it more mercifully and lovingly to someone who asks. And I will pray for the day when all Christians will be united in this belief and will be able to receive the Eucharist with a united "Amen!"

The Faith of the Canaanite Woman

Today's Gospel puzzled me (Matt 15:21-28). What is Jesus doing ignoring a Canaanite mother pleading for her daughter to be healed of a demon's torment? Why insult her calling her a "dog"? Is Jesus excluding all Gentiles saying he "was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel"? After all, God sent his Son "to save the world" (John 3:16-17; 12:47). Jesus sent his followers to "Go make disciples of all nations" (Matt 28:19). And Jesus first revealed himself to the Samaritan woman (John 4:26) and cured the servant of the pagan Roman centurion (Matt 8:5-13).

The Canaanite woman recognized Jesus as divine, addressing him "Lord" and "Lord, Son of David." She "did Jesus homage," evoking images of a humble supplicant bowing or kneeling before Jesus. Jesus knew her heart and how dearly she loved her daughter. His words sound rude to us, but Jesus was not insulting her. He sought to draw out her faith and humility more fully than by just calling him "Lord." Earlier Jesus had said, "Not everyone who says 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven; only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven" (Matt 7:21). The Canaanite woman showed her faith and trust in God's mercy by persistent prayer and humility by calling herself a "dog," or "whelp," because she knew and admitted she was a sinner.

We do the Father's will by loving him alone with all our heart, soul, mind and strength, and our neighbors as ourselves (Mark 12:30-31). We demonstrate our belief that Jesus is our Lord and Savior by worshiping him in prayer, kneeling when his Body and Blood are raised before us in Mass and the priest intones "Behold the Lamb of God," and by bowing or kneeling as we receive him in Holy Communion.

We show our humility by admitting we are sinners, confessing our sins to Christ in the person of his priest in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

So Jesus was not attacking the Canaanite women. He loved her and her daughter. He cast out the demon, one of those who vex us and "prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls." As Jesus had explained to the Samaritan woman, "salvation is from the Jews" ... first (John 4:22). But because he fulfilled the New Covenant by his sacrifice, death and resurrection, all who love and who submit humbly to the will of the Father will be saved.

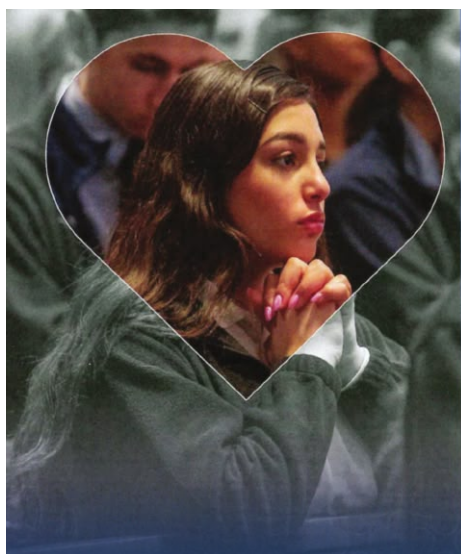

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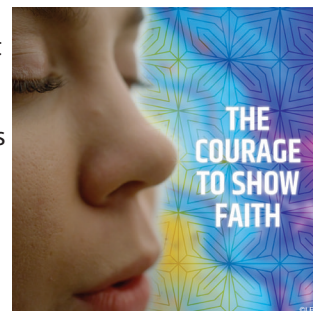

long outside the covenant. There,
a Canaanite woman calls out, **"Have pity
on me, Lord, Son of David."** At first, he is
silent. Then he rebuffs her. **"It is not right
to take the food of the children and
throw it to the dogs."** But the Church
Fathers saw this not as an insult but as
an initiation. Christ draws out of her
heart a deeper faith.

She presses on. **"Please, Lord, even the
dogs eat the scraps that fall from the
table of their masters."** Jesus' silence
and response solidify her humility and
trust. She thus becomes a model for
prayer for centuries of Christians. St.
Augustine said she shows how sinners
come to grace by moving from silence
to humility to perseverance.

This woman is the Church. She is you
and me. She is every soul who dares to
cry out from the margins, who endures
divine silence until it turns to compas-
sion. When Jesus says, **"O woman, great
is your faith,"** it is the joyful cry of God
discovering faith where the world least
expects it. Even the smallest crumb of
Your mercy, Lord, is enough to heal the
soul. Do we have the courage to show
faith like that?

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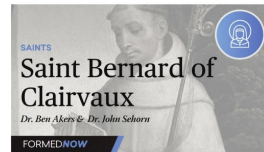

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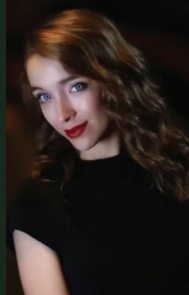
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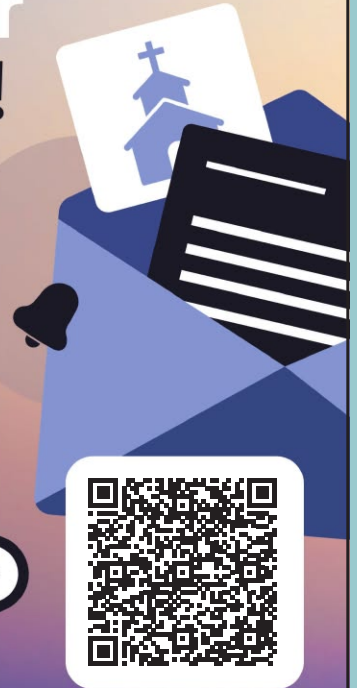
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
