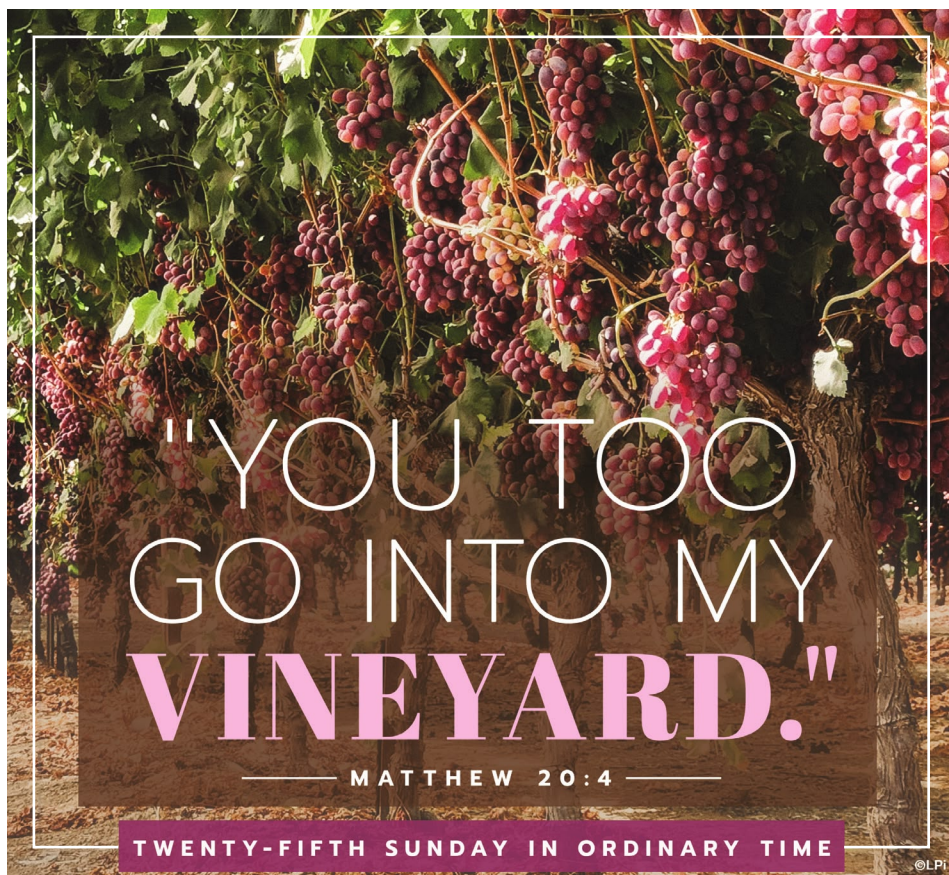

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

Being a Missionary Disciple: As a Missionary Disciple, I am encouraged to share the **kerygma** (kuh-rig-muh) with others. Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News using **seven (7)** practical steps: **1. Start with Prayer; 2. Build a connection; 3. Share your experience; 4. Use clear, simple language; 5. Introduce to your community:** Community provides a space where your ONE can ask questions, share experiences, and grow with others in faith; start inviting your ONE to something informal like a social event or casual gathering; over time, as he becomes more comfortable, he may be open to participating in other things—observe, listen, and ask. **6. Encourage participation; 7. Be patient yet persistent.** Ready for Step 6? ...

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Fall may be an opportune time to walk (literally?) with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist... Ready to TAKE another STEP?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

STEP 2 Seek God's BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, to shower BLESSings on your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE.

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Active participation by the sick: Particular attention needs to be given to the disabled. When their condition so permits, the Christian community should make it possible for them to attend the place of worship. Buildings should be designed to provide ready access to the disabled. Finally, whenever possible, eucharistic communion should be made available to the mentally handicapped, if they are baptized and confirmed: they receive the Eucharist in the faith also of the family or the community that accompanies them.

PRAY: Throughout the week ... Come Holy Spirit, Give us hearts aflame for the disabled. Open our eyes to truly see them when they attend Sacred Heart, being ready to offer any assistance they may need in order to participate fully in the Mass. And also enable the mentally handicapped to "receive the Eucharist in the faith of the family that accompanies them." Amen!!

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Do I notice when someone who is disabled in any way attends Sacred Heart? Do I consider how I might help? Helping to get them to and from their car? Opening a door? Welcoming and helping to a seat? Being sure they receive communion? And do I know anyone who is mentally handicapped? How can I ensure they receive the Eucharist as part of our "family that accompanies them"?

There is Always God's Mercy

Is it ever too late to turn one's life towards God? To repent from sin? To seek God's mercy? No. Never in this lifetime.

Today's readings continue lessons begun two weeks ago when Jesus taught of our obligation to lovingly encourage others to turn away from sin (Matt 18:15-20). Last week Jesus showed we must always forgive each other every offence for the good of our eternal souls (Matt 18:21-35). Today's readings teach we can, and should, turn to God any time to seek his forgiveness and mercy (Matt 20:1-16).

That seeking is mutual and began with God. He took the first step. The Prologue of the **Catechism** (¶1) teaches how God, **"in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to ... share in his own blessed life. For this reason ... God draws close to man"** and calls on us **"to seek him, to know him, to love him"** despite our being **"scattered and divided by sin."** God sent Jesus as Savior to invite us to become **"his adopted children and thus heirs of his blessed life."**

God took the first step. The next step is ours. Jesus came saying, "Come and follow me" (Matt 4:19), be my disciples. We are free to seek him even though, and especially because, we are sinners. The first reading today tells us to **"seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near."** Though we may be wicked scoundrels, we should **"turn to the Lord for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving"** (Isaiah 55:6-9). We sing Psalm 145 today in praise for **"the Lord is near to all who call upon him, gracious and merciful, slow to anger, rich in kindness ... good to all and compassionate toward all."**

Christ's parable of the laborers in the vineyard is less about blessings (wages) given generously whenever laborers come. The point is not the grumblings of the early workers at perceived unfairness. The key message is that the landlord, the king, keeps going out to seek workers where they are even late in the day. Our Lord continues to **"draw close."** We in turn should continue to **"seek the Lord while he may be found"** ... in Scripture, in the Liturgy, in the Church, in our hearts. Jesus is as near as the Eucharist. Seek him there. He is as near as the Confessional. It is never too late to seek him and his mercy there, no matter how long we may have ignored his call **"to share in his own blessed life."**

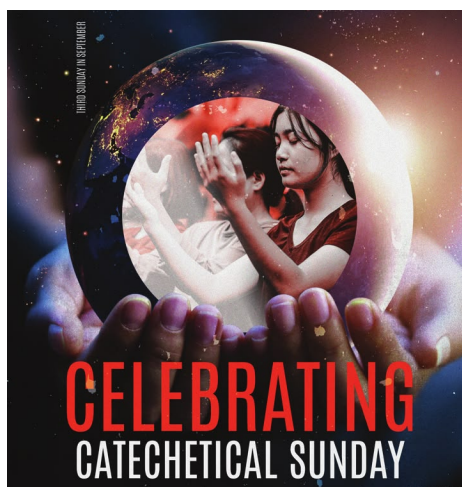


St. Vincent de Paul "FRIENDS WALK" FUNDRAISER

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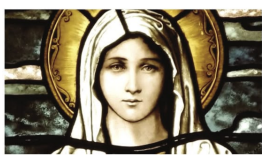
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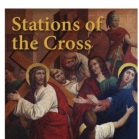
