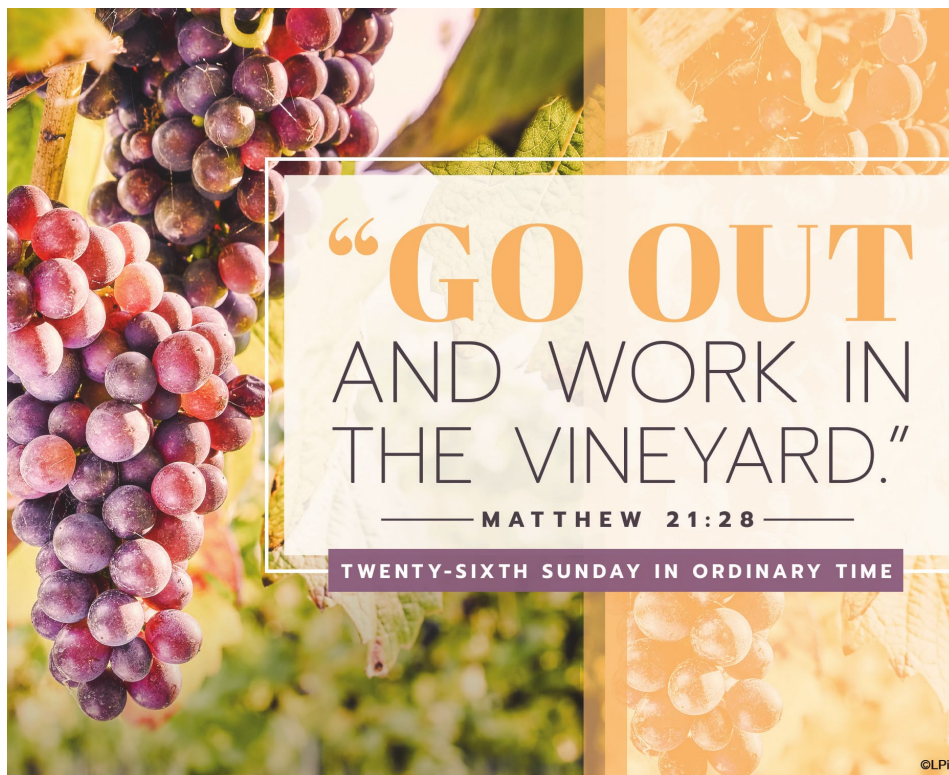

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

*The bread that I will give is my
flesh for the life of the world.*

John 6:51

Being a Missionary Disciple: As a Missionary Disciple, I am encouraged to share the **kerygma** (kuh-rig-muh) with others. Simply put, the Kerygma is the Gospel, the "Good News" using seven (7) **practical steps**: **1.** Start with Prayer; **2.** Build a connection; **3.** Share your experience; **4.** Use clear, simple language; **5.** Introduce to your community; **6. Encourage participation in the sacraments:** The sacraments are the key means of receiving God's Grace in this life. Encourage your ONE to come to Our Lord in Confession and then the Eucharist. Explain how both have strengthened YOU. Jesus said, "I am the living bread . . . Whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:51). If your ONE is not Catholic, encourage her to walk up to receive a BLESSing during communion at Mass—the blessing brings God's Grace too. If they are hesitant at any time, offer to go with them—accompaniment always builds and encourages (both of YOU!). **7.** Be patient yet persistent. Ready for Step 7? . . .

WALK THE WAY OF THE EUCHARIST YOURSELF: as YOU walk with your ONE:

TAKE BLESS BREAK GIVE

Fall is a time of new beginnings, and a good time to start to walk with your ONE on the path to the Eucharist. . . Ready to TAKE the first STEP? Or another?

STEP 1 TAKE in Jesus—in prayer, Adoration, in His Word and especially in the Eucharist. TAKE your ONE with you.

STEP 2 Seek God's BLESSing in communion with the Holy Spirit, to shower BLESSings on your ONE and YOU.

STEP 3 BREAK open opportunities; let God BREAK open YOUR heart and BREAK through to your ONE.

STEP 4 GIVE of yourself to your ONE—your time, a listening ear, an invitation, attention, accompaniment. Be a GIFT to your ONE.

LISTEN to POPE BENEDICT XVI: Care for prisoners: The Church's spiritual tradition, basing itself on Christ's own words (Mt 25:36), has designated the visiting of prisoners as one of the corporal works of mercy. Prisoners have a particular need to be visited personally by the Lord in the sacrament of the eucharist. Experiencing the closeness of the ecclesial community, sharing in the Eucharist and receiving holy communion at this difficult and painful time can surely contribute to the quality of a prisoner's faith journey and to full social rehabilitation. [We must] do whatever is possible to ensure that sufficient [effort] is invested in the spiritual care of prisoners.

Sacramentum Caritatis 59

PRAY: *Throughout the week . . . Come Holy Spirit, Open our hearts to hear the cry of those in prison and to answer their call in whatever way we are able. Help us to see their need, not their sin. Open our eyes and ears to hear and see them in their need to be "visited personally by the Lord," and to "experience the closeness of the ecclesial community." Let us find ways to "contribute to the quality of a prisoner's faith journey." Amen!*

ASK & ACT: What are these words saying to **ME**? Have I ever considered involvement in a prison ministry? Have I thought about the Gospel messages we've heard these last few weeks about forgiveness, and how that might apply to those in prison? Maybe I could join a ministry taking communion to prisoners. Or maybe I could send cards, letters, or books at Christmas or Lent to prisoners, encouraging them in their faith. Maybe I could contribute financially to a prison ministry. I will pray, asking the Holy Spirit to lead me, and check out the aod.org website, searching prison ministries, to see what is available and how I might be a missionary of mercy to a prisoner.

"That's Not Fair!"

"That's not fair!" We've all said it when we didn't get what we thought we were owed. Young children holler it when cookies are miss-shared. Teens mumble it when their chores are due. People carry signs with it to protest wrongs. In last week's Gospel parable, the workers arriving early at the vineyard essentially cried "*That's not fair!*" out of envy when the generous landowner paid all workers the same daily wage. All this means we have an innate sense of fairness, even if our perceptions of justice may differ.

Last week's Gospel was about the "unfair" generosity of God's mercy. Today's readings are about how we can see God's judgments as unfair. God is Love, and truly **both** infinitely merciful and infinitely just. Ezekiel reminds us God hears the cries against him from those who think he is unfair for expecting us to follow his law and be responsible for our behavior. God says: "*You say, 'The Lord's way is not fair!' [but] . . . Is it my way that is unfair, or rather, are not your ways unfair?*" (Ez 18:25-28). In passages leading to today's Gospel, elders are challenging Jesus, criticizing him for associating with tax collectors and prostitutes. It was not fair that he be with sinners. In today's story Jesus asks the elders to judge the behavior of two sons (Matt 21:28-32), both free to act as they choose. The first son says he will not do the father's will, but he does. The second says he will do the father's will, but does not. The first son, though he said no, changed his mind, repented, and chose to do the will of the father. Ezekiel would say he found his path in the "*way of righteousness*," and "*turned away from all the sins that he has committed*" so, in God's judgment and mercy, "*he shall surely live.*"

If we choose not to do God's will, not to follow his Law, we face divine judgement. Yet when we change our ways, whatever sin we may have committed, and humbly ask for forgiveness, God in his infinite mercy will grant it. That mercy is possible only because Jesus "*taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness. . .*" to be with us sinners "*humbled himself becoming obedient to the point of death on a cross*" (Phil 2:1-11). Was there ever anything more unfair?

So we pray today's Psalm 25, "*Remember your mercies, O Lord. Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me your paths, guide me in your truth, and teach me, for you are God my savior.*"
